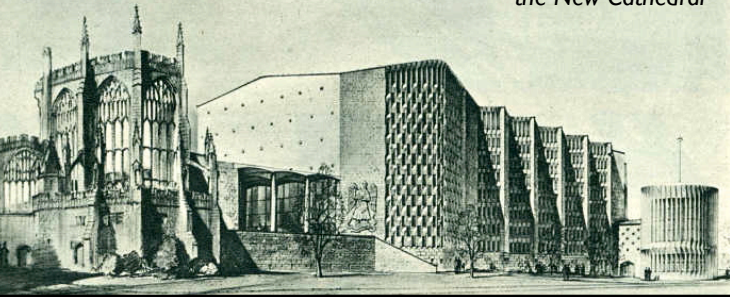
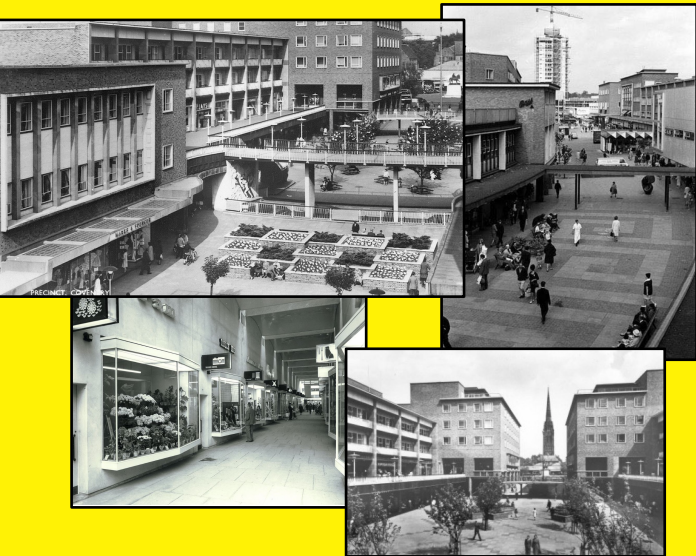


Coventry Cathedral is one of the most important Post-War buildings in Britain. It is listed at Grade I, and was consecrated in 1962.

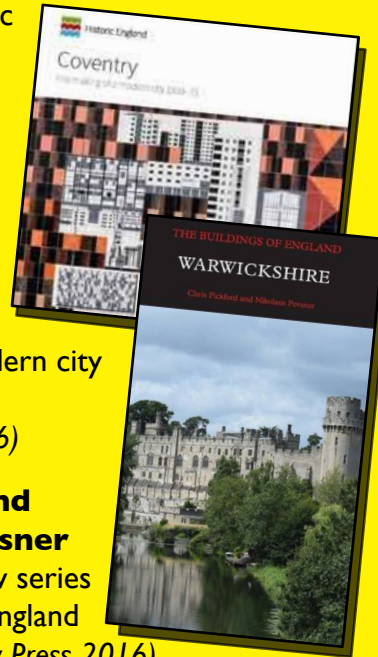
